1. Minutes of the previous meeting

- Anne Newman asked for clarification regarding the meaning of mixed developments under point 3 of the previous minutes. MF reported that developers are only interested in residential developments as commercial or mixed developments are more risky/less profitable.
- The minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 20th March 2018 were approved

2. Information items arising

- Contact with TWBC: MF has chased the Borough, who stated that they were busy but agreed to submit a report by the NP meeting (18th April). This was received at 5.30pm on the day of the meeting. MF to read and decide on action required.
- Andy Mackie agreed to circulate information regarding the community centre

3. To discuss the Access and Movement policy (p68-79 of the draft plan)

• Amendments were made to the policy document to ensure all elements from the different groups have been included (see attached).

- It was suggested that a pedestrian and horse should be added to the mini pictures on the front page of this policy
- Accessible should be included in the first policy objective
- AM1: there is an issue regarding what we call footpaths; JF suggested 'footway' for footpaths and 'carriageway' for roads as these are the government terms used. Note made to look at conditions on Church Farm and re the access to Putlands, but no decision re wording here.
- AM2: Suggested wording about bridleways in paragraph three needs to be discussed further
- AM4: Consideration needs to be given to expanding the policy justification

• CW provided a brief update on the Sports & Recreation group – the background paper has been updated and the policy document populated. One of the group has offered to draw a plan of the proposed sports hub site to go in the policy.
