





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Background




- Over the past eight years Paddock Wood Town Centre Council have been progressing with a centre to meet the growing local community needs. With 1,000 new homes planned for the area there is a greater need for community space and this has now been deemed essential by the neighbourhood plan process.
- A range of site options for the new centre were available and these have slowly been reduced to two viable location options: the Wesley Centre and the Memorial Field. Of the two, the Memorial Field is the preferred option, it is favoured due to its ease of access from the main street and the availability of the land.
- In order to support the development of the new centre and provide a clear design brief, feedback from local residents has been collected. A public consultation ran for a four week period closing on 1st March 2017. The consultation consisted of a questionnaire (see Appendix A) available in paper and digital formats. The questionnaire consisted of a mixture of closed and open questions. The objective of the feedback was to understand:
 - the different venues residents of Paddock Wood used;
 - the range of activities residents were participating in at these venues;
 - satisfaction with current community venues;
 - facilities residents would like to see available at the new community venue;
 - any concerns in relation to the proposed community venue development.
- The consultation was an open consultation, promoted in the local area. The promotional activity included an informative postcard delivered to 3,800 Paddock Wood residents, advertising in the local newspaper and via social media channels, as well as posters within the local community. 182 residents participated in the consultation giving it a response rate of 4.8%, this is considered an average response rate. However, the 182 responses were of high quality with just two of the participants failing to answer every question in the consultation.

The participants




- 182 residents participated in the consultation, it must be noted that as this was an open consultation therefore no demographic quotas were enforced. The below outlines the make-up of the consultation participants alongside the residential demographics for Paddock Wood.
- There is some over-representation of age groups and gender in the results. Those aged 65+ and/or female were more likely to have responded to the consultation.
- However, the responses indicate the consultation has captured information from those using existing facilities (99% of those taking part had done so) and therefore the response does allow the objective 'how community facilities are being used' to be fulfilled. However, when reviewing the results it will be important to be mindful of the demographics of those parting part (and due to the response size weighting the data is not appropriate).



Putlands Sports and Leisure Centre

These were the top 3 most visited Paddock Wood community venues (visited by the consultation participants, in the six months prior the consultation - Aug'16-Feb'17).

62% of the consultation participants had visited the Memorial Field in the past six months.



The football pitch and café were the most visited facilities at the Memorial Field.



It was also referenced as a dog walking area.



4.4 venues visited

In the six months leading to the consultation participants visited on average 4.4 different community venues for different activities. This suggests no one venue is meeting their needs.

Across all venues on average 70% of participants rated the existing venues as 'excellent' or 'good'.

However, areas for improvements were identified, key ones included:




The new centre needs to be:

- Provide a large multipurpose space for the Paddock Wood community.
- Provide access to the latest sports equipment, for multiple sporting activities.




Use of existing venues



Participants were asked to acknowledge (from a list provided) which local community venues they had visited in the last six months (August 2016 – February 2017).


Q. Which of the following venues/facilities have you, or any member of your household, visited in the last six months?



- Of the existing community venues and facilities available in the Paddock Wood area, St Andrew's Church, Putlands Leisure Centre and Paddock Wood Primary School were the three most visited.
- Less commonly accessed were the Memorial Ground Cricket Pitch and Tennis Courts, as well as the Social Club on Lucknow Road. However, lack of multiple usage opportunities at these facilities is likely to be driving this (i.e. you can only play tennis at the tennis court).
- Others mentioned included: Greenlane, Scalliwags Pre-School, Elm Tree Football Club and Foal Hurst Woods.


A higher proportion of other in the raw data this has been back coded as some as had specified a venue from the list. 6

Multiple venue use




Across the six months leading to the consultation, participants visited on average, **4.4** different venues (of those listed in the questionnaire) in the Paddock Wood area.

The multiple venue use suggests there is no one single community venue meeting residents' needs and as a result residents are having to visit a range of different locations for recreational activities.



Purpose of use



Those taking part in the consultation were asked to detail, in their own words, the reason for their visit to the community venues. These responses have been analysed and grouped into five overarching themes:

Children



- Clubs such as Guides, Scouts and Brownies
- Play and creativity groups (music, soft play etc.)
- Children's events (parties for example)

Active



- Sports clubs (for example running club)
- Fitness classes
- Gym
- Track/pitch

Education



- Primary or secondary school
- School operated activities

Community



- Council meetings
- Neighborhood planning
- Polling
- Blood donation

Social



- Non-sports or non-children focused clubs such as choir and U3A
- Quiz nights
- Bar
- Party venue
- Café
- Dog walking

Sale




- Jumble sales
- Flea markets
- Specialist sales (for example, jewelry)

Worship



- A church venue
- Religious worship
- Religious services (funerals, weddings etc.)

Purpose of use



- Over a third (34%) of participants who accessed the local venues were doing so to engage with social activities (quiz nights, non-sports clubs, cafes etc.)
- Activities and clubs for children were the reason why a fifth of the consultation participants visited a venue (20%).
- Participants were also likely (16%) to have accessed a venue for active reasons (i.e. sports clubs, gym, fitness classes etc.).
- And to a lesser extent they had visited for: community events, sales, education (some venues are in fact, schools).



Venues by activity




The activities that had been accessed at different centres continues to demonstrate the lack of one centre encompassing all needs for the Paddock Wood community. Most of the centres available to residents were developed for a single purpose, however supplementary activities are now operating within them (for example: schools and churches now hosting fitness classes and activity groups).

Centre by the top 3* stated reasons for a visit (*when a top 3 score is below 15% it has been omitted).

The Memorial Field



In total, amongst all consultation participants, 62% had visited the Memorial Field in the past six months.

- Looking specifically at the different facilities available at this location, the community café and the football pitch were the most visited amongst the consultation participants. The cricket ground and tennis courts were visited less frequently. The field and pitch areas were commonly described as dog walking areas as opposed to being used for sporting activities.



Of those who had made a visit to Memorial Field:

37% visited the café



37% visited the football pitch



18% used the cricket ground


**In 2016 the cricket ground was formally used for matches just 8 times. There is no resident cricket team based at the ground.*

When sharing their reasons for visiting the café the play park was frequently referenced.

The football pitch and Memorial Field grounds are being used frequently as a dog walking area and not for their designated sporting function.




Some participants were frustrated with the booking system for the tennis courts and felt this prohibited its use.

Understanding users further




- 33% of the consultation participants were male, most of which were aged 65+.
- The top 3 visited venues (St Andrew's Church, Putlands Leisure Centre and Paddock Wood Primary School) continued to be so amongst the male participants. However, male participants were more likely to have visited the Day Centre on Commercial Road and the facilities at the Memorial Field (75% of male participants vs. 56% female participants had visited the Memorial Field).
- Male participants were more likely than the female consultation participants to be accessing venues for community and social based activities.





- When focusing on the under 55s males only, Putlands Leisure Centre is the venue visited the most.
- Active based activities also increase when the over 65s are excluded.

Understanding users further




- 67% of the consultation participants were female, most of which were 65+.
- The top 3 visited venues (St Andrew's Church, Putlands Leisure Centre and Paddock Wood Primary School) continued amongst female participants. However, female participants were more likely to have visited the Masonic Hall (for quiz nights, fitness classes and children's parties).
- Female consultation participants were more likely than the male participants to access venues for education and worship. However, the differences in activities between men and women are indicative and not significantly different.


Female participants by age




Reasons to visit



- Female participants were less likely than the male participants to have visited the Memorial Ground facilities.

Ratings of existing venues




At an overall level*, participants felt satisfied with the venues they had made use of, with an average of 70% rating the venues they had visited in the last six months as 'excellent' or 'good'.

- Of the most visited venues amongst participants (St Andrew's Church, Paddock Wood Primary School and Putlands Leisure Centre), St Andrew's Church was rated most positively and Putlands Leisure Centre the least. Of all centres, the Wesley Centre was rated most negatively (39% excellent/good, 44% average and 17% poor/very poor).





% of venue visitors rating the venue as 'excellent' or 'good'







Rating of the Memorial Field



Current facilities at the Memorial Field were rated less positively than the overall average.

- Across all venues, the average 'excellent' or 'good' score recorded was 70%, the Memorial Field facilities (as a collective) scored 47%.
- The recorded score of 47% is also below the ratings scored by the top 3 most visited venues.



Several participants who had visited the Memorial Field had done so for dog walking. A small proportion of these wanted to see a designated dog walking area.

The improvements needed



St Andrew's Church, Putlands Leisure Centre and Paddock Wood Primary School were the most visited venues amongst participants of the consultation, reviewing the improvements needed to these venues identified common themes: the need for a local swimming pool, larger venues, ample parking and fit-for-purpose sports facilities.



Hopes for the new venue




Participants of the consultation were asked (via a spontaneous open-ended question), what facilities they would like to see in their new community centre, these were grouped into three core overarching themes (below).

The focus of the facilities sought does reflect the activities most commonly being engaged with (by the consultation participants). This may suggest that the new centre is seen as replacing some of the existing venues as opposed to adding to them. With many visiting multiple centres across the town there is a potential need in the Paddock Wood community for one hub meeting all community needs.



An inclusive venue:


- a facility that attracts all ages from across the town, with facilities and services dedicated to children and adults alike;
- a centre that is easily accessible via bike, foot, road or public transport.

- a venue that can host a range of different activities and events, ranging from fitness classes, to stage productions, screenings and parties.



- modern sports facilities to replace the 'outdated' services currently available;
- multipurpose facilities allowing for a range of sporting events to take place;
- a swimming pool facility which is not available elsewhere in the town.

A venue that attracts all



62% of the open-ended responses sat within the 'inclusive' theme, inclusivity ranged from having activities for all types of Paddock Wood resident, to ample parking and socially based facilities such as a café and bar.

- 12% would like to see the inclusion of a café area at the new centre. The café at the Memorial Field is already used by a range of different user types; some accessed it while their children played in the park, others whilst they had been watching or engaging in sport and some had used it as a social meeting point (although the 'no dogs allowed' rule aggrieves a small proportion).
- There is a desire amongst some for the new community centre to bring people of all different ages together and a proportion believed there was a need for 'young person' provision in the area. With this in mind, there is a potential opportunity for the new centre to create a hub for young people.


Inclusive venue needs:

- Easy access via car, bike, foot or public transport.
- There is a lack of one centre in Paddock Wood that fully incorporates all sports, social and community needs. The new centre should look to do this.

"A nice café with after-school activities. An area with internet access/quiet areas for people to study. Hall/rooms for fitness clubs and education i.e. languages and skills."

"An internet café, a meeting place for different ages."

A large multipurpose space




- Cross referencing the needs from the new centre against the improvements participants outlined for the community venues they already used, identified a need in the Paddock Wood Community for a large, open, community hall space.
- A hall space capable of holding large groups (100-300 given as examples by participants) is wanted; kitchen/catering facilities are also considered as a facility to be included. A stage area and opportunities for members of the local community to hire the facilities was also desired by some.

Large space needs:


- Multipurpose, suitable for a range of activities
- Large, with a potential 100-300 capacity
- Comfortable, adjustable, high quality seating
- Available for potential hire by residents

“Seating accommodation for about 100-150 people with a large screen TV. Tea/coffee bar and car parking.”

“Very large meeting hall for dancing, films and large events. Small meeting rooms. Refreshment facilities. Computer facilities for business and young people. Other facilities for young people in the evenings.”

“Stage, café, bar, kitchen, to hold events in PW. Meeting rooms, space for health and other local services. Would like potential to hold parties and weddings if possible (close to St Andrew's Church). This could involve having a garden area.”

Fit for purpose sports facility



- There are currently sports facilities available across the existing venues, however through analysing the improvements the consultation participants would like to see, a view was identified that these were 'unfit for purpose', 'outdated', 'old-fashioned' and 'small'.
- A quarter (25%) of the consultation respondents would like to see the new centre incorporate new sports facilities. There is a desire for an improvement on what is already available in the Paddock Wood community, as well as a need to fill the gaps in existing facilities. The key gaps identified were the lack of a swimming pool in the Paddock Wood area, as well as multiple weather and multi-sports pitch facilities.

“A swimming pool would be amazing. Dance/exercise classes in the evening.”

“A better gym than Putlands!”

“Whatever happened to the swimming pool? Everyone can use that from babies up to retired people.”

“Replace the pavilion, squash court for hire, decent sized hall for functions/clubs modern changing rooms for football!”

Sports facility needs:

- The sports facilities need to be multipurpose in order to maximise usage but also be fit for purpose (with high quality equipment).
- The sports events often coincide with social activities with friends and family spectating. Incorporating and allowing for seating/observation areas will be important, as well as access to facilities such as cafes and toilets for spectators.
- Outdoor facilities should have accessible changing and toilet facilities.

Other considerations



"We have been waiting for a community centre for years. Lots of talking, paper promises for many years and we are still waiting. How about some positive action."

"I am sure that Scouts would move their meetings to the community centre rather than using the church and school."

"An eco building that has solar panels, grey & rain water recycling and a bio boiler."

"St Andrew's playing field and memorial grounds walkways could be far improved. They lack interest/colour/planting/water areas. Could be far more inspiring and pleasant places to spend time in."

"Good lighting and sound system. Hall hire needs to be competitive. Lower rates for local people."

"I feel very grateful for all the baby groups, especially for new mums and new people to the area. I do wish we had swimming facilities as I would prefer to put my money into supporting Paddock Wood community."

"Transfer of facilities and activities from St Andrew's recreation ground."

"Smaller rooms to hire for craft groups etc. An alternative sight for Scout/Cub groups. Most of all it would be a great place for a Pre-school. I know the existing Pre-school has such a great reputation in the village, but it is turning people away - they should be given the opportunity to expand."

"Do away with athletics track (not used), a new swimming pool for all ages would be more useful . A complete waste of money on building an athletics track that since it opened I never see used!"

Concerns raised



Aside from an 'anti-development' stance the common concerns raised were:



Parking availability at the Memorial Ground.

"make sure there is sufficient car parking at the new community center"

It should NOT detract from other venues and heaven forbid become a white elephant. "



Lack of community involvement in the new centre development.

"we should not lose the tennis courts"

"I think consideration should be given to an alternative site given the proposed housing developments"



The new community centre detracting from other Paddock Wood venues.

"The location of the proposed community center should not impinge on the cricket field as this should remain as a cricket field.




Questions around if the 'need' justifies a new centre in the area.

"I would place it where the police station is, then it could use the memorial grounds carpark and link with the football pitches and all weather surface. The police could either share it with the fire brigade or move into another council building closer to the centre of Paddock Wood."




Questions surrounding revenue sustainability for a new centre.

Conclusions



- There are a number of different venues already existing in the community and being accessed by Paddock Wood residents. On average, each consultation participant accessed 4.4 different venues in the six month period prior their questionnaire completion.
- The multiple centre use is driven by the different activities participants undertook and indicates that there is no one venue that encompasses all needs. A key role of the the new centre could potentially be to bring together all the different activities within one central hub.
- The new centre needs to be an inclusive venue, one that attracts both young and old. The inclusivity includes ease of access be it by car, bike, foot or public transport. Participants are keen to see the new centre have a large multipurpose space with kitchen/catering facilities and potential for a stage. Sports facilities are also important, there is a desire for improvements on the facilities already offered by Putlands Leisure Centre, as well as a swimming pool.
- The Memorial Field has been sign posted as the preferred venue for the new community centre and the research with residents suggests this would be a good fit, residents want a centre which is easily accessible (which the Memorial Field is with access from the main road). While a small number have concerns regarding development at the Memorial Field, the feedback from the consultation participants indicates that while it is being used by some, it is not being used for its designated function. More participants were using for it dog walking and visiting the café as opposed to playing football, cricket or tennis. The new centre on this site should allow for these activities to remain in the area (inclusion of a café and green space for dog walkers), as well as meeting the needs outlined above.




