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SOUTHERN WATER WORKS GREEN LANE

Agenda item ES41

The following issues have been raised with the contractors regarding the works at Green Lane. A formal notice has been served on the council advising that works will not start until three months after the notice has been served. Southern Water have advised that it is likely to be next spring. The routes for the work are also attached.

It is estimated the pond at the end of Green lane is at least 3 metres deep.

The depth of the pond will depend on the datum used. Do PWTC have any as-built records of the pond

We have surveyed the bed level of the pond to be 20.19 m AOD, the banks are approximately 22.26 m AOD at the highest point meaning that the depth of the pond from top of bank to bed level is 2.07m. The level of the crown of the pipe crossing beneath the pond at this point is 18.219 m AOD giving clearance of 2m below the pond.

Are PWTC aware of any lining / other measures we need to be aware of to the pond?

(Clerk's note - A search will be made to see if any further records are held)

There is a manhole cover in the middle of the recreation field, and it is not known what that is connected to and via what route.

Our survey has identified inspection chambers in the field to be field drainage (0.9 – 1.4 m deep). We have identified BT ducts and a LV power cable crossing the field.

there is a system of drainage between the football pitch and the highway that drains surface water away from the pitch (presumably to a highways surface water drain. The proposed construction will not impact on this area. For access we will provide protection to below ground services.

There is a French drain within the hedgerow on the northern edge of the field.

Open Space at end of Green Lane

The preferred route appears to pass beneath mature trees so could the council have details of the tree protection measures that will be in place.

The intention is to construct the rising main in this area by directional drill, drilling beneath the root zone. We have undertaken a survey of trees and are in the process of assessing the impact of our works and any mitigation measures required.

Any damage to mature trees, drainage systems, the attenuation pond, and the grass surface of either area with must be repaired or reinstated by you.

Any damage caused to the area will be reinstated as existing to your reasonable satisfaction. Following the tree survey, we are adjusting the line of the sewer in Green Lane slightly to avoid a tree on the edge of Green Lane and the junction of Church Road.

As the pond is a surface water flooding attenuation feature and should therefore be surveyed prior to the works as its operation cannot be compromised.

We have already undertaken a topographical survey of the pond which can be provided. We are fully conversant with the design, construction and operation of SUDS and understand the importance of the pond.

Also, it would be beneficial if you or someone from MGIV could meet with our estates manager so he can explain the drainage on the recreation field.

We agree that a meeting with your Estates Manager should be undertaken prior to works commencing to confirm the location of assets, confirm condition, agree reinstatement, and agree ongoing liaison during the works.
